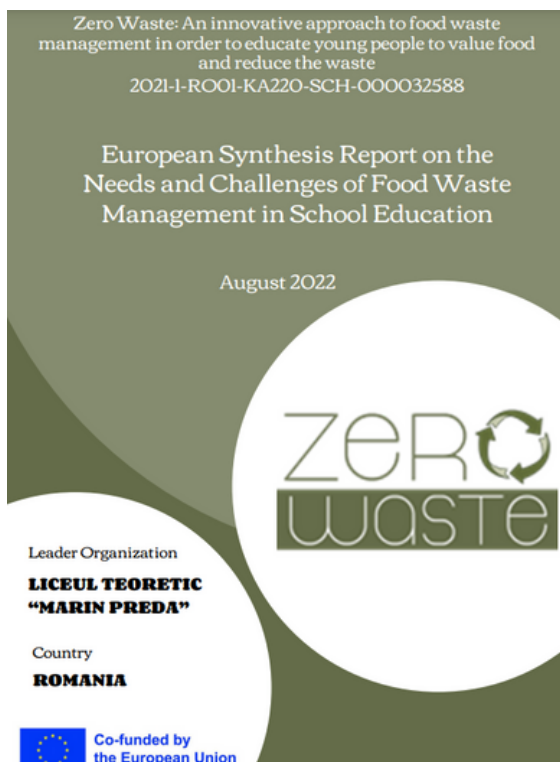
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PROJECT RESULTS

PR1 - ZERO WASTE European Synthesis Report on the Needs and Challenges of Food Waste Management in School Education



In order to provide the framework for the project, we delved into extensive research in the project's initial phase, both on a desk and in the field. Our collaborators were tirelessly putting together a synthesis report (PR1) that synthesizes the research already available concerning the requirements for and difficulties in reducing food waste in schools. The information in this report is essential for refining materials. We were conducting field research utilizing structured questionnaires in our literature review, so we were not simply sitting at a desk. This strategy was designed with our core target in mind: secondary school instructors and students. We put all of the insightful information we acquired into a report titled "European Synthesis Report Analysis on the Needs and Challenges of Food Waste Management in School Education."



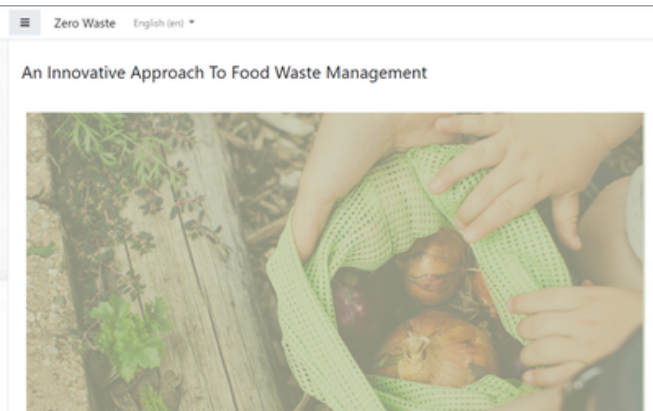
